

INFORMATION REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF VIDEO SURVEILLANCE ON THE WORKING PREMISES OF MERSTEEL SSC d.o.o.

2. Contact Information of the Data Protection Officer

The Data Protection Officer at the Controller is not appointed.

3. Purposes for which personal data are processed

The processing of personal data using the video surveillance system is carried out to ensure the security of individuals and property.

4. Legal Basis for the Processing of Personal Data:

Article 6(1)(f) of the General Data Protection Regulation in connection with Articles 76, 77, and 78 of the ZVOP-2.

5. Legitimate interests pursued by the controller:

The controller processes data with the legitimate (lawful) interest of the controller, i.e., ensuring the protection of individuals and property. Before implementing video surveillance, the controller conducted a necessity test, considering the demonstrated risk of product theft, theft, property damage, work-related injuries, and the need to establish monitored transport routes, concluding that the establishment of video surveillance for the protection of property and life is necessary. These purposes cannot be achieved with milder means that have been proven ineffective in the past. The processing of personal data is necessary to achieve this legitimate interest and significantly contributes to achieving the purpose for which video surveillance is carried out. The controller's legitimate interest does not override the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the individuals to whom the data relate.

6. Storage Period:

Recordings are kept for a maximum of 60 days after creation. Copies of parts of recordings made and used for the purposes of asserting, exercising, or defending legal claims are kept until those purposes are fulfilled, until the proceedings in which they are asserted, exercised, or defended are concluded, or, if such proceedings do not occur, for a maximum period until the claims expire.

7. Users or categories of users of personal data:

The controller may transfer personal data obtained in the course of video surveillance to third parties only if there is an appropriate legal basis or to the police if it is legally permitted and necessary for the exercise of their powers.

8. Information on specific processing impacts, particularly further processing:

The controller will process personal data recordings exclusively for the primary purpose - for the purpose for which video surveillance was established, except when the recordings are used as evidence in all those cases where a deviant event occurs (e.g., property damage or theft) and the recordings are used to assert, exercise, or defend legal claims related to such an event.

9. Unusual further processing:

Live monitoring:

The video surveillance system may be implemented by recording and archiving recordings and by directly monitoring events live by an explicitly authorized company employee.

10. Individual Rights:

The individual whose personal data are processed has all the rights regarding the processing of personal data as specified in the General Regulation and the ZVOP-2:

- the right to information and access to personal data
 - where appropriate, the right to rectification, erasure, restriction of processing, portability, objection, and the right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing.
- The individual has the right to request access to personal data (record) only in the relevant part where they appear in the recording. For this purpose, the request must be specified by clearly stating the presumed location in the recording, the date, the most precisely defined time period, and their reference photograph (or description of appearance, clothing, etc.), and when submitting the request, they must also identify themselves appropriately. The controller provides the individual with the requested copies free of charge; however, in the case of repeated or unfounded requests, the controller may charge material costs for the provision. The individual can address the request to the Controller by post or email, as stated in point 1 (Controller's Contact Information). If the individual believes that the controller is violating their rights regarding personal data, they can lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner (Information Commissioner, Dunajska cesta 22, 1000 Ljubljana, Slovenia, gp.ip@ip-rs.si).

11. Existence of automated decision-making/profiling:

Automated decision-making and/or profiling are not carried out.
